Talking about the facilities and infrastructure of the Shivalik Public School, Sector 78 , it has a very easily accessible and well-connected campus with modern amenities and a contemporary outlook. Having well-designed classrooms for interactive learning. The school is digitally smart and embraces a child-friendly environment. The multipurpose hall of the school serves as a hub for

extracurricular activities, events, and gatherings, complemented by ample green spaces promoting holistic education. The school's active social media presence and dedicated app facilitate seamless communication and connectivity, while the regular newsletter updates the school community on all activities. The school has a strong parent's teachers association to get inputs of the parents on all the important issues and PTA's are also held at regular intervals to engage the parents in the learning process.

Let's reflect on our journey of last one year. We at SPS-78 curated a diverse range of both curricular and co-curricular activities throughout the year for the holistic development of children. We gathered on the same platform last year to present our musical play, 'The Lil Voyagers.' Since that point to the present, a year has swiftly transpired. The academic session 2022-23 concluded with lively celebrations in December, with events like Hasye Kavi Sammelan, Sahibzada Diwas, Grandparents' Day, Red Day, and Christmas. The subsequent months of January and February in the year 2023, saw enthusiastic student participation in Sports Days, separately organized for the kindergarten and primary sections, celebrating both physical prowess and team spirit. As the inaugural batch of Shivalik Public School, Sector 78, successfully completed their final exams in March, they ventured into the next academic year with remarkable success.

The commencement of the academic session 2023-24 saw a dynamic start, featuring a comprehensive parental orientation program in April. This was followed by Founders Day cum Baisakhi celebrations, including a path ceremony on the school premises. Earth Day and World Book Day were observed in the same month to instill environmental awareness and promote a culture of reading. In May, students expressed gratitude to workers on Labor Day through the distribution of goodies, and the month concluded with a heartwarming Mother's Day celebration. The pre-summer festivities were enhanced by an engaging carnival with puppet shows, bubble fun, fireless cooking, tattoo making, talent shows, and movie time.

In June, the celebratory spirit continued as students observed Father's Day, World Environment Day, and Yoga Day. August brought Independence Day celebrations with diverse activities, including craftwork, poster making, fancy dress and quiz competition. The thematic focus on "Meri Mitti Mera Desh" and "Har Ghar Tiranga" was eloquently captured by the RJ from 90.8 FM, providing our children with the opportunity to share their views on the radio. Teej was celebrated with traditional vibes and Raksha Bhanhan was improvised as Vriksha Bandhan, where students pledged to protect trees by tying rachis to them. Commemorating the birth anniversary of Major Dhyan Chand, our school celebrated National Sports Day in August with various games promoting physical fitness and mental agility. Auditions for the renowned reality show Indian Idol were also hosted. September brought celebrations for Teacher's Day and Janmashtami. As October unfolded, Gandhi Jayanti was observed with a special assembly honouring the teachings of father of the nation. Dussehra festivities resonated through the campus with crafts, dances, enjoyable activities, and a picnic, culminating in a Ramleela performance to celebrate Dussehra. November witnessed vibrant Diwali celebrations with

Students also participated in a variety of academic enrichment activities during the session. These activities that includes experiential learning, art-integrated learning, value-based learning, critical thinking and collaborative activities are an integral part of our regular classes. Our curriculum prioritizes The Demonstration and Evaluation program, held in September and October that provided parents with a unique opportunity to witness their children's learning experiences through diverse activities stimulating both hemispheres of the students' brains. Special initiatives like Rhyme Days and Calligraphy competitions enhanced phonetics, vocabulary, and handwriting skills. Symbolic color-themed days, such as yellow and blue, added vibrancy to the learning environment. Show and Tell sessions fostered conceptual clarity and confidence, while thematic assemblies enriched the overall academic experience.
